

# The Litter Codes

- ★ Refuse collection service is mandatory for all improved premises.
- ★ Each residence must have one or more 32-gallon trash receptacles, with tight-fitting, water-tight lids and no holes. Plastic bags shall be used for yard waste only.
- ★ Receptacles, plastic bags and refuse shall not be readily visible from public streets except during times fixed for collection and except for those in approved shelters or housings.
- ★ All receptacles shall be removed from public view not later than 6PM on collection day and set out not earlier than 6PM the day prior to collection, except for those in approved shelters or housings.
- ★ Bulk items such as car parts, weight goods, furniture and the like shall not be stored in such a manner as to be readily visible by the public.
- ★ Owners or persons occupying or having control of the premises must dispose of all refuse which has accumulated on the premises.
- ★ All commercial properties, including hotels, motels and multiple family dwellings, shall have adequate removal of refuse to include dumpsters or refuse cans large enough to handle the volume of trash and removal that is frequent enough to prevent overflow.
- ★ Unregistered vehicles stored on the street or on private property and constituting a visual nuisance shall be deemed abandoned and removed by the City or County at the property owner's expense.

# Our Mission

Our mission of improving the visual quality of the Tahoe Basin portion of El Dorado County is accomplished through community education, citizen involvement and enforcement of litter & nuisance ordinances, under the auspices of our seven-member Board of Directors.

# Our Services

## Litter Removal

Our Response Team Drivers follow regularly scheduled routes to remove litter from roadways and neighborhoods, assisted by volunteers and El Dorado County Sheriff's Department Work Release crews as available. The Clean Tahoe Program responds to citizen complaints, and works in conjunction with City and County agencies to remove visible litter and illegally-dumped articles from vacant lots and along roadside easements.



## Courtesy Notices

We remind businesses, rental managers, local residents and off-site property owners of City and County litter ordinances by issuing Courtesy Notices when violations are observed or reported. Copies of these notices are posted on the property and mailed to owners. Clean Tahoe re-inspects the property in 10 days, and, if needed, refers the problem to the appropriate jurisdiction for further enforcement.



## Community Cleanup Day

Early each summer, the Clean Tahoe Program, along with South Tahoe Refuse Company, sponsors a Community Cleanup Day. Residents can take refuse and bulk items to the Transfer Station for a minimal fee. The balance of the dumping fees are paid by the Program.

Community groups and residents volunteer to clean designated areas in the City or County. Volunteers receive free trash bags and dump passes. The Program also helps sponsor a Cleanup Day each Memorial Day weekend in Tahoma on the West Shore.



## Community Education

The Clean Tahoe Program provides citizen education on causes of and solutions for litter problems, through articles in the print media, public service announcements on TV and radio, appearances at local events, and by presentations for schools and local service organizations.
